Aprostocetus neglectus (Domenichini) (Hym., Eulophidae, Tetrastichinae), a parasitoid of Exochomus quadripustulatus (L.) (Col., Coccinellidae) in Britain. — During a study of the pine ladybird, Exochomus quadripustulatus in Millhouses, Sheffield (VC 63) we removed defunct pupae from the trunks of a group of park trees (Tilia x vulgaris Hayne, Acer pseudoplatanus L. and Fraxinus excelsior L.) between 19.i. and 23.iii.2002. On the final examination of pots containing eighteen pupae on 1.v.2002, at least thirteen chalcids had emerged. Emergence was not witnessed but about 25% of overwintered, effete pupae at this site bore small (<1.0mm), circular punctures. Samples were sent to Dr R.R. Askew and identified as Aprostocetus neglectus (Domenichini). Dr Askew notes that the species has been recorded as a parasitoid of various coccinellids (Chilocorus, Coccinella, Exochomus and Scymnus species) widely across Europe but apparently not recorded from Britain. The species is covered in the revision of European Tetrastichinae by Graham (1987, Bulletin of the British Museum Natural History (Entomology), 55(1): 1–392).
